Enhanced Glass Recycling Process

- Container glass recovered through Rumpke Recycling commercial and residential programs is processed at Rumpke Recycling's regional glass processing facility in Dayton, Ohio.
- Enhanced glass recycling technology implemented in Nov. 2011 will process about 40,000 tons of broken and mixed glass each year for use in both fiberglass insulation and container glass industries.
- The new recycling technology is possible through a \$4 million investment by Rumpke Recycling, along with a \$500,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) accepted by the City of Dayton.
- Rumpke Recycling has partnered with Ohio firms Owens-Illinois and Johns Manville to secure markets for the glass product.



Rumpke Consolidated Companies

- Founded in 1932, Rumpke is one of the largest privately owned waste and recycling firms in the United States.
- The company opened a Dayton location in 1987 and currently employs about 300 people in the market area. Rumpke has operated a glass recycling facility in Dayton, Ohio since 2002.
- Rumpke's Dayton location includes a hauling fleet of about 200 trucks, a maintenance garage, customer service call center, material recovery facility (MRF) and a glass recycling facility.
- In 2007, Rumpke received the Dayton Better Business Bureau Eclipse Integrity Award for marketplace ethics.
- Other Rumpke divisions include Rumpke Recycling, Rumpke Portable Restrooms, The William-Thomas Group, Rumpke Hydraulics and Rumpke Ballpark.
