# Bond Road Landfill History

#### **MARCH 1965**

Jennings Sanitary Dumping System, Inc. leased the Bond Road Landfill from Chester and Vivian Wilson. Jennings Sanitary Dumping System, Inc. provided disposal service for Monsanto's plant located in Addyston, Ohio.

#### 1980

Monsanto purchased approximately 110 acres from Chester and Vivian Wilson and the solid waste license from BFI. BFI entered a contract with Monsanto to provide hauling and landfill operation services through the 1980s.

## 1990

The Ohio EPA issued a Permit to Install to Monsanto.

# 1994

Monsanto submitted a Permit to Install application for landfill expansion which included Phases 2, 3, and 4 of the current landfill.

# 1997

Part of Monsanto became Solutia, Inc. Solutia created Bond Road Site, Inc. a wholly owned subsidiary of Solutia.

#### 1972

Browning-Ferris Industries
(BFI) received a solid
waste license and acquired
Jennings Sanitary Dumping
System, Inc. (including
the lease agreement for
disposal on the land), and
continued providing hauling
and disposal services for
Monsanto.

## 1987

Monsanto purchased 24 contiguous acres in Dearborn County, Indiana. In 1988, Monsanto submitted a Permit to Install Application to the Ohio EPA.

## 1992

Zorn Engineering submitted a Phase 1 Cell Liner and Construction Certification to the Ohio EPA which consisted of lining the western and southern portions of the "grandfathered" un-lined hill.

#### 1996

Rumpke Waste & Recycling entered into an initial agreement to purchase and manage the Bond Road Landfill as a municipal solid waste landfill for Monsanto.

#### 1998

Rumpke Waste & Recycling purchased Bond Road Site, Inc. in December 1998.
